Unanimously AGREED.

It was **AGREED** to discuss both applications together.

A brief history of this application was received.

Matters raised included:

- 1. Net biodiversity gain
- 2. Parking space allocation
- The Local Plan Settlement Strategy and the ability of local infrastructure to support the development
- 4. Design and layout in relation to sustainable energy standards
- 5. Assessed needs and out-commute
- 6. Balance of market housing
- 7. The capacity of existing vehicular, cycle and pedestrian infrastructure to support these applications

Representations were made by members of the public in attendance. Issues raised included the impact the development would have on flooding, particularly in light of the Environment Agency's data being estimated. Traffic impact on North Street and exit roads out of the parish. Sustainability. Parking. Highways and wildlife, and carbon reduction strategy.

A proposal was put forward that the Parish Council objected to application **19/02656/FUL** on the following planning grounds:

- 1. The proposals for achieving net biodiversity gain are inadequate.
- 2. The number of off-road car parking spaces is below that required by national and local standards.
- The number of additional homes is greater than the number that can be supported by the current infrastructure and undermines the local plan settlement strategy.
- 4. The design of individual houses and the layout of the estate generally do not meet acceptable sustainable energy standards.
- The number of houses exceeds all objectively assessed needs and will increase out-commute from the village above the existing figure of 80%.
